Spring Quarterly Meeting

The Spring Quarterly Meeting will be held in the meeting room on the lower level of the Grandview Heights Public Library, 1685 West First Avenue, on Sunday, May 7 at 2:00 p.m. Donald Schlegel, local historian and for over fifteen years editor of the Society's monthly Bulletin, will present his recent research on "The Life and Thoughts of Madeleine Vinton Dahlgren" -- or, "Washington Goes Ga-Ga over Gallipolis Girl." A convert to the Catholic Faith, Mrs. Dahlgren (1825-1898) was wife, mother, author, builder, anti-suffragette, and society queen. She was perhaps the most interesting lady to come out of Gallipolis in the nineteenth century. The talk will be illustrated with slides.
